## **Concept Note**

**Priority theme:** Addressing the social impact of multifaceted crises to accelerate recovery from the lingering effects of the pandemic through the full implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

Side event: Re-Imagining Digital Health Systems to Create Access to Services, Workforce Development, and Innovative Education

**Challenge:** We know that employment is a determinant of health equity and deficiencies in labor markets (especially since the pandemic) have further marginalized communities from access to healthcare. Disruption in labor markets has also led to increased informal employment (among immigrant, migrant, refugee, and other vulnerable populations) with no health protection system in place. How do we ensure that those not employed or in informal, short-term, temporary employment situations have access to healthcare?

**Solution:** Create digital health ecosystems as a social protection measure to ensure that individuals do have an option.

**Implementation of Solution:** Through partnerships, coalition building, and strategic measures, different stakeholders must come together and make commitments, including infrastructure development, private sector buy-in, and collaboration with regional and local systems.
